Dr Agate Foster, the Mayor of Patchogue, is breaking ground for the new incinerator on Waverly Avenue in 1931 The incinerator was erected at the cost of \$53,300 and began operating early in 1933.



The incinerator at the Municipal Garage complex on Waverly Avenue could handle all the Patchogue refuse and had enough capacity left to accept refuse from Bellport. Operational in 1933, the incinerator was shut down in the 70's because it could not meet the environmental requirements. In this 1957 picture all the highway department equipment is lined up for the photographer.
