I could see you. I would be glad to answer any thing
on it. I am not much of a wrighter. So if you want me
let me know please. and I will come. I do not know where your
Office is. I did not get wounded. I got gased Oct. 9.

1918, and did not see any more of the Battel line.
After the War ended I came home. One of the lucky ones to get
home first. I am sending you a picture that I had
tacking just as soon as I got home. I hope it is all
right. This will be all. Hoping to here from you if you
want me to come and tell you more of my War Experience

Will be glad to do any thing for the town of Patchogue
