


The Granada Theater was located on the south side of West Main Street, half way between Railroad Avenue and West Avenue. This popular movie house was built in 1928 for the owner, Samuel Savener. The theater opened November 22, 1928. Although it was a popular theater, it closed in 1947, most likely due to the competition of the other two Patchogue theaters. In the 1960's the "Two Guys" variety store operated from this building for several years. The building was eventually torn down and today the 6th District Court is located on this site.
