This picture of the Mills building was taken in April 1927. It stood on the southeast corner of Ocean Avenue and Main Street. Ludwig Brall's United Cigar Store, William's Apparel Shop and Aldrich's Electric Store occupied the ground floor with many smaller businesses on the second floor. The New York Telephone Company had their switchboards located on the second floor until their new building next to the Methodist Church was completed.
