The Whelan Drug Company conducted their business for a few years around 1945 from the Arcade building on South Ocean Avenue, which was part of the Mill's building. The Mill's building complex, built in three separate sections, extended for 93 feet on Main Street and 190 feet on South Ocean Avenue.
