The Patchogue Electric Light Company was sold in April 1925 for \$1,100,000 to the Associated Gas and Electric Company, which took control, but the plant kept operating under the name Patchogue Electric Light Company, or Pelco, as it was commonly known. In 1964 the Long Island Lighting Company added Pelco to its system.



For many years Pelco's offices were located on South Ocean Avenue, next to the Union Savings Bank. These facilities were becoming too small as the company grew. In 1951 new office and service facilities for the company were constructed on the southeast corner of East Main Street and Conklin Avenue. This is the show room.
