by the Town Board of Brookhaven,
IN RELATION TO
OYSTER LEASES.
Resolved, That this Board will lease
lots in the South Bay for the purpose of
planting and growing oysters, not exceed-
ing six acres, to any one person, for the
annual rent of \$1.50 an acre, payable
annually in advance, and in case the rent
is not paid in advance before sixty days
from the time it so becomes due, the lot
or lots so unpaid shall revert to the town
to be re-let.
