

On the east side of Ocean Avenue, bordering the bay, stood the Ocean Avenue Hotel, built in 1878. The owner and proprietor was Sanford Weeks. Later additions more than doubled the size of the notel. This picture shows the hotel before the turn of the century with the old Mascot Hotel on the right.

This is the Ocean Avenue Hotel as seen from the Mascot Dock, c. 1910. A large addition had been added, and the Roe annex building on the right has been connected by a covered walkway. At the time of this picture, the hotel could accommodate 275 guests.









The New Mascot Hotel stood opposite the Ocean Avenue Hotel. It was built in the early 1880's and was owned by Ruth N. Smith. George Rogers was the first proprietor, and it was called the Rogers House at that time. About 1900, it was going under the name of Pasco Hotel and then it became the New Mascot after the old Mascot was moved in 1905.
