



The Central Hotel was located on the south side of West Main Street, 100 feet from the Four Corners. Clay Losee bought the hotel in 1880 and rebuilt it several times. In 1882, it could accommodate one hundred guests. The basic building still exists today, but its appearance has changed greatly. Now stores and offices occupy the building.
