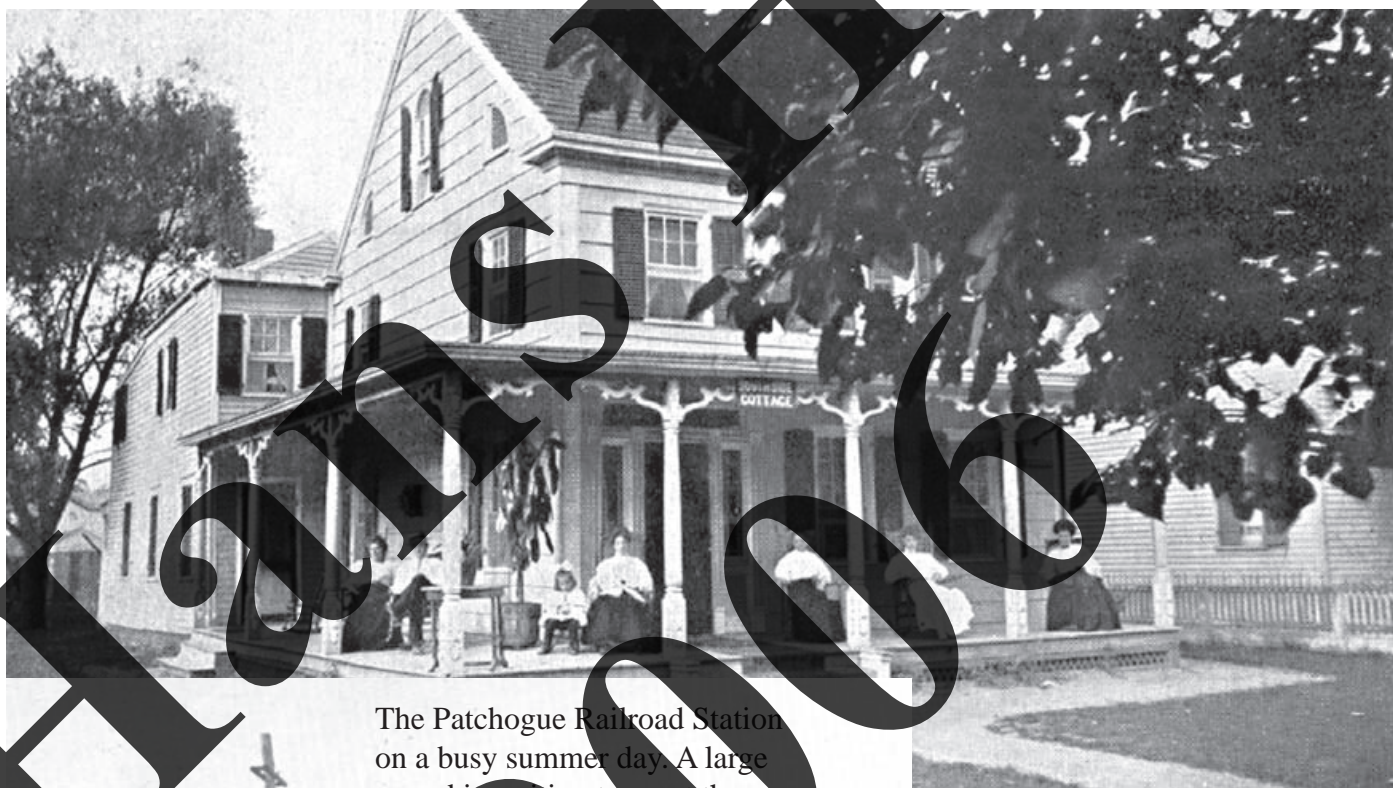
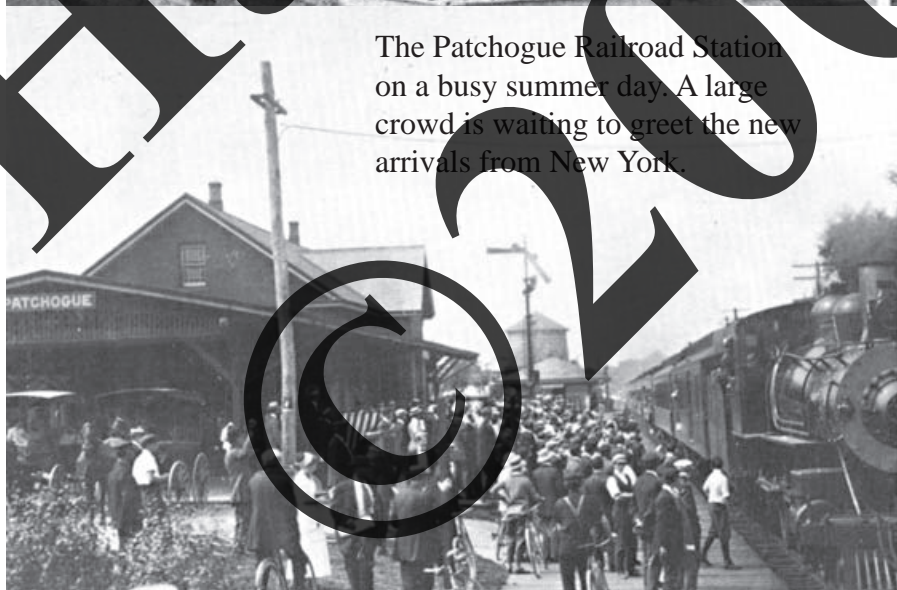


Captain L.B. Thurber was the proprietor of the Bay Avenue Cottages in the 1890's. Later on it became the Patchogue Inn. The south part of the inn, connected by a covered walkway, burned in 1991. The main building today is a private home on the southeast corner of Bay Avenue and Newin Street.
