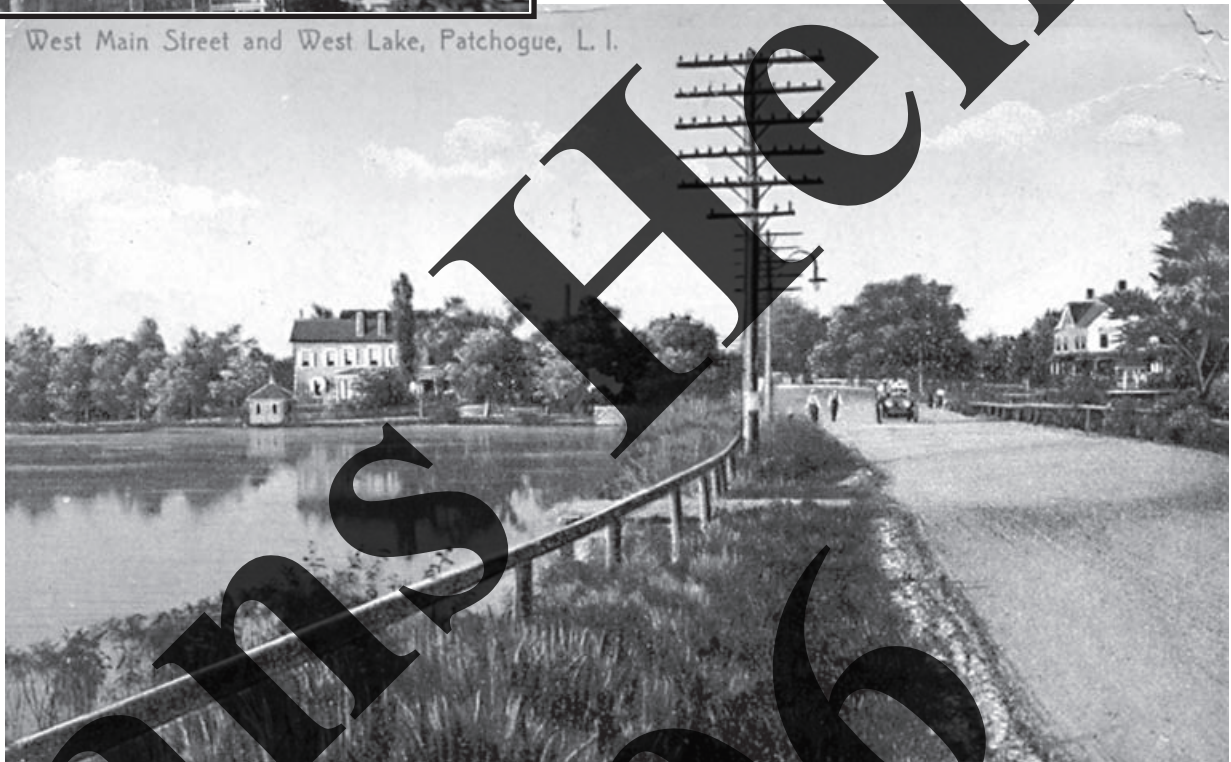


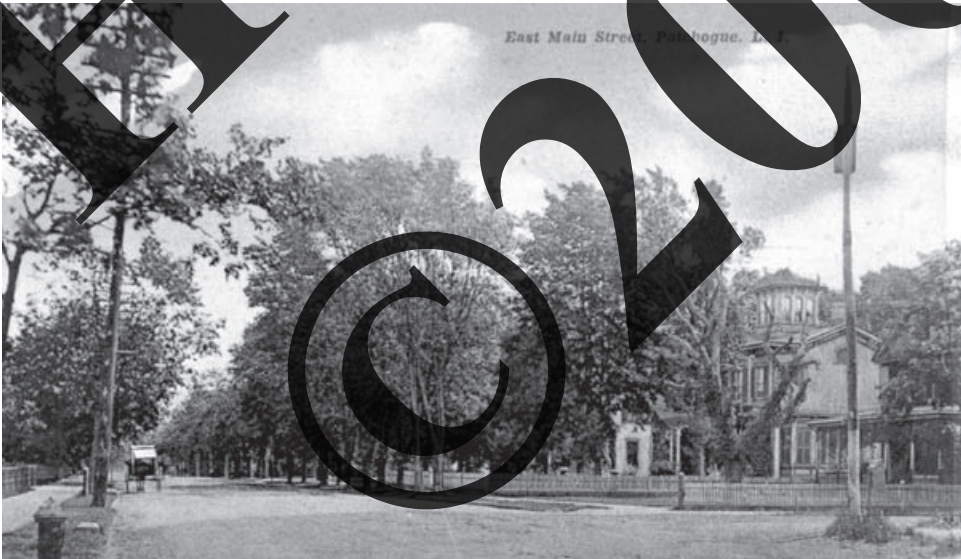


The Syndicate Building on the north side of West Main Street was built in 1898. A group of prominent Patchogue businessmen formed a stock company to buy the property from lawyer Jennings to erect a store and office building. The post office was on the third floor until 1916. The arrangement under the sixth window from the left helped to pull the mail bags up. A fire destroyed the upper floor on September 10, 1967.



A 1905 view shows Main Street and the West Lake. The actor Elmer Grandin owned the large home on the left side, which has not changed much to this day.

The building on the right was Leo's Inn, which burned in 1941. Today, The West Lake Inn catering hall, also formerly known as Felice's, stands on this spot.



Late in the nineteenth century, East Main street was a tranquil street bordered by large trees and beautiful homes. This is the corner of Rider Avenue. Dr. Terry's home, the one with the porch, was the corner house and the next house belonged to S. E. Roe.
