The Patchogue Advance Building on the east side of North Ocean Avenue, a short distance from Main Street, was built in 1908. The founder of the Patchogue Advance newspaper was Timothy J. Dyson. The first issue came off the press on September 1, 1871. There were several short-term owners of the paper until James A. Canfield purchased it in 1892 and operated it until his death on July 21, 1924.



The Metropolitan Tobacco Company had their store on 20 South Ocean Avenue. This is a company delivery truck. In the 1920's, the tobacco company moved into the old Unique Theater on South Ocean Avenue, two buildings north of Gerard Street.
