



The Jesse C. Mills home was built in the 1890's on the south side of East Main Street, halfway between Rider Avenue and Medford Avenue. This large home had nine fireplaces and four chimneys. Large water tanks in the attic could store the accumulated rainwater. This house was demolished in the 1950's.



The J. H. Mills home stood on the east side of the Jesse C. Mills home, opposite today's Elks Club. It was built during the same time period. The Mills family owned the large store on the Four Corners. This house was torn down many years ago.



The Gelston G. Roe mansion was built shortly after 1900 on the south side of East Main Street, approximately 150 feet west of Rider Avenue.
